3,4	Recover R to right side, Step L to left side, [3.00]
&5,6	Close R next to L, Rock L to left side, Rock R to right side
7,8	Rock L fwd, Rock R back
S3: Fwd, Lock	, Fwd, Brush, Fwd, Lock, Fwd, Brush,
S3: Fwd, Lock , 1,2,	Fwd, Brush, Fwd, Lock, Fwd, Brush, Step L fwd to left diagonal, Lock R behind L,
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1,2,	Step L fwd to left diagonal, Lock R behind L,
1,2, 3,4	Step L fwd to left diagonal, Lock R behind L, Keeping on left diagonal step L fwd, Brush R fwd to right diagonal,
1,2, 3,4 5,6 7,8	Step L fwd to left diagonal, Lock R behind L, Keeping on left diagonal step L fwd, Brush R fwd to right diagonal, Keeping on right diagonal step R fwd, Lock L behind R,
1,2, 3,4 5,6 7,8	Step L fwd to left diagonal, Lock R behind L, Keeping on left diagonal step L fwd, Brush R fwd to right diagonal, Keeping on right diagonal step R fwd, Lock L behind R, Keeping on right diagonal step R fwd, Brush L fwd
1,2, 3,4 5,6 7,8 S4: Step, Pivo	Step L fwd to left diagonal, Lock R behind L, Keeping on left diagonal step L fwd, Brush R fwd to right diagonal, Keeping on right diagonal step R fwd, Lock L behind R, Keeping on right diagonal step R fwd, Brush L fwd t, Turn ½ and ½, Fwd, Back, Coaster Cross

Step L back, Close R next to L, Cross L over R
